Is this course for me?

This qualification reflects the role of individuals who perform a limited range of tasks relating to identifying and inspecting mechanical and electrical components and systems of light vehicles, heavy vehicles, outdoor power equipment, bicycles, marine craft and motorcycles.

Through theory and practical course work you will learn to:

- Identify mechanical and electrical systems
- Use and maintain tools and equipment
- Inspect, test and service batteries
- Install vehicle lighting and wiring systems

This qualification also covers the skills and knowledge required to perform minor maintenance and repair of an automotive vehicle body.

Career Opportunities

This qualification can be undertaken as a pre-apprenticeship program and allows for inclusion of skills suited for entry as an apprentice automotive mechanic.

Trade outcomes are achieved through an Australian Apprenticeship.

Entry Requirements

There are no prerequisite entry requirements; however you must:

- Show a satisfactory level of language and literacy skills, which will be established at the time of enrolment
- Show a genuine interest in the automotive industry
